

English

As authors, the texts, 'The Little Red Hen' and 'Chapatti Moon' will be read by pupils and they will retell the traditional stories and recognise and use verbs.

Using these texts, pupils will learn to write:

- With the correct pencil grip and sitting position
- With the correct letter formation
- Using finger spaces between words
- Using capital letters and full stops
- By sounding out independently to spell simple words

Reading skills pupils will focus on are:

- Sounding out independently to read words and short sentences
- Discussing the title of a text, word meanings and comprehension for understanding

Maths

As mathematicians, pupils will learn about: Number.

Place Value (within 20)

- Number recognition and formation
- Number order including one more and one less
- Counting forwards and backwards up to 20
- Use < > and = symbols to describe number

Addition and Subtraction (within 20)

- Use resources to add 2 numbers together
- Use resources to subtract 2 numbers
- Record using + - and = symbols
- Use correct mathematical vocabulary during discussion

Science

As scientists, pupils will learn about: Animals Including Humans and Seasonal Changes (Autumn).

Pupils will be taught to:

- Identify, name, draw and label parts of the human body
- To say which part of the body is associated with each sense
- Observe changes across the four seasons
- Observe and describe weather associated with the four seasons and how day length varies

Scientific Enquiry Skills:

- To identify and classify
- To observe closely

Computing

As computer scientists, pupils will:

- Recognise common uses of technology both inside and outside of school.
- Use technology purposefully to create, organise and store digital content.
- Use technology safely and respectfully, keeping personal information private and identify where to go for help and support when they have concerns.

Basic skills:

- To remember a username and password
- To access and explore an application
- To use and develop mouse skills
