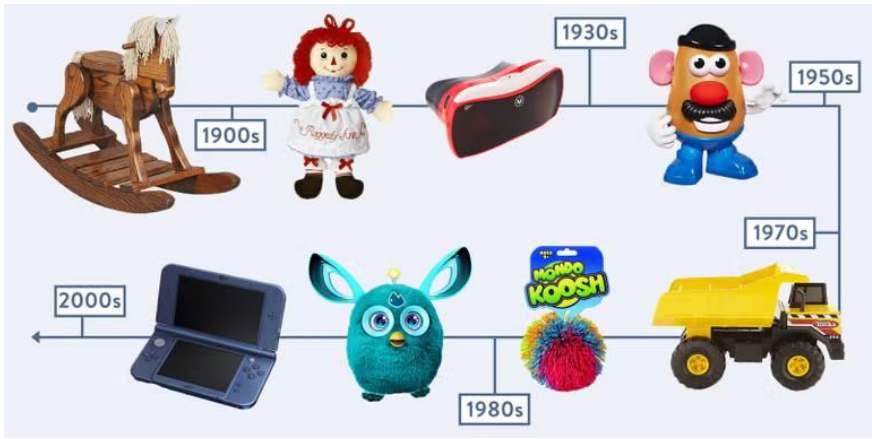


Knowledge Organiser Year 2 history: How do our favourite toys and games compare with those of the recent past?

Sequence	Events or things in the correct order.
Primary source	Information and object that come from the time being studied.
Secondary source	People's views of the information and objects made after the time being studied.

Primary Sources

Primary sources are information and objects that come **from the time** being studied. Some examples include:

- letters
- diaries
- tools
- speeches
- photographs
- clothing
- songs and poems
- artwork
- census data
- weapons

Some primary sources provide facts. Others give us the opinions of people who experienced that time period.

Secondary Sources

Secondary sources of historical information are people's views of information and objects which are made **after the time** being studied. Some examples include:

- text books
- commentaries
- documentaries
- newspaper articles
- websites
- essays
- podcasts
- biographies

They use primary sources to create their summaries or explanations of different events from the past.
