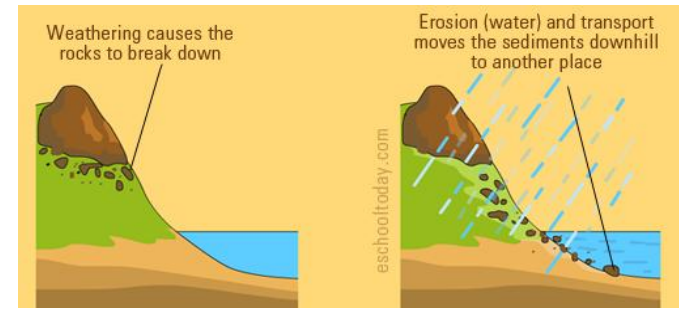
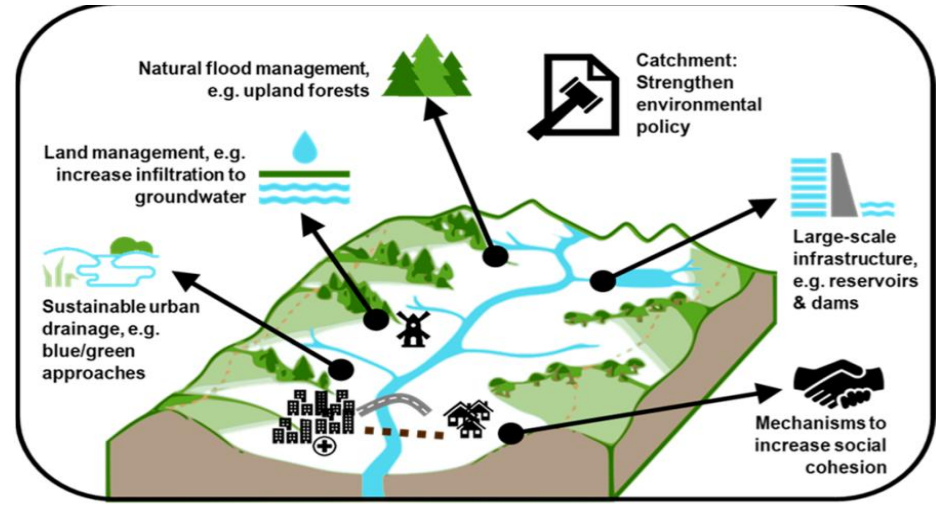
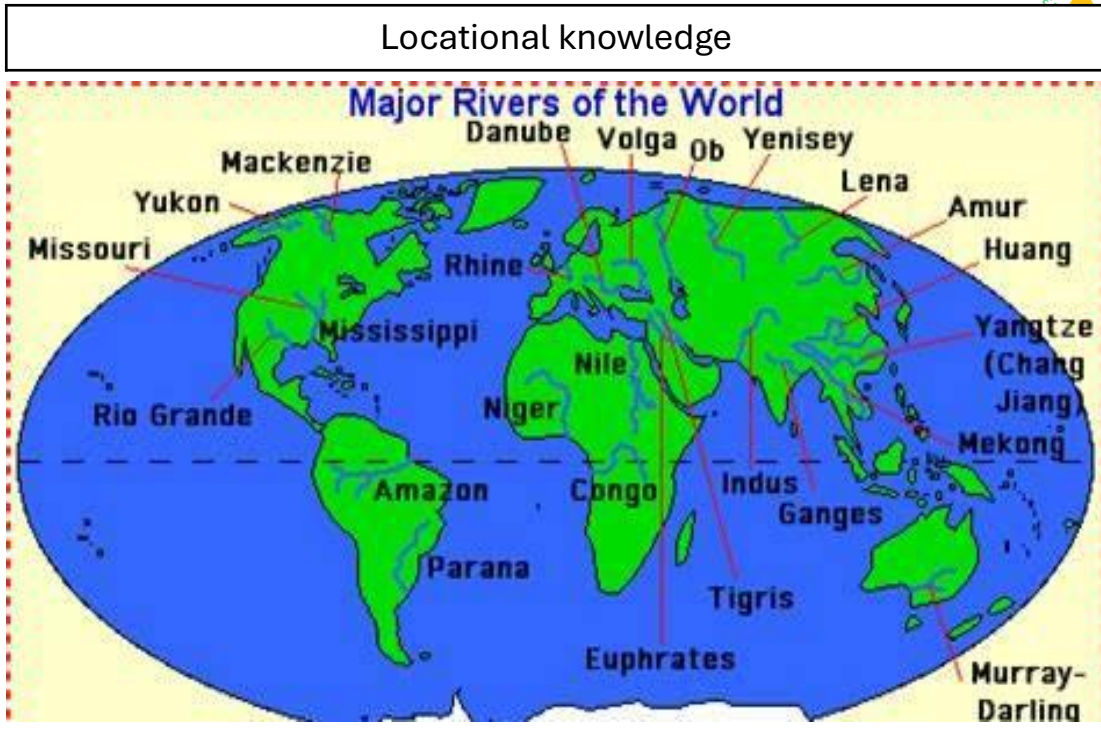
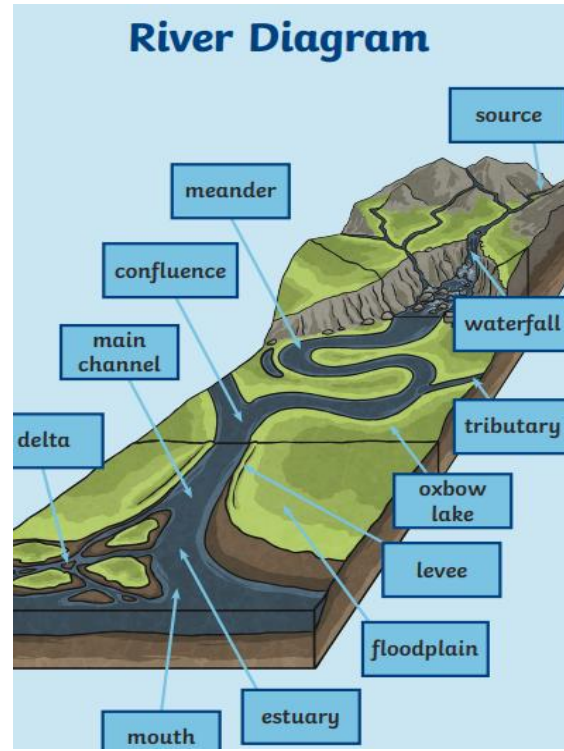


# Knowledge Organiser Year 6 Geography: How do rivers move?



Key Vocabulary	
Source	the start of a river.
stream	a small body of flowing water. It joins with other streams to form a river.
River	a large body of flowing water that flows towards its mouth.
Delta	triangle of sand and soil <b>deposited</b> at the mouth of some large rivers.
Estuary	an area of freshwater that meets the ocean.
Erosion	the process of natural features being gradually worn down, perhaps by wind, water or rocks
<b>Deposition</b>	laying down of <b>sediment</b> carried by wind, water, or ice
<b>Sediment</b>	Sand, mud, pebble particles which are carried away by wind/water.
Diversion	Changing path/ going down a different route.
Flood defences	Systems put in place to avoid flooding or flood damage.
